Recommendation 1

Take steps to strengthen oversight of Program recipient eligibility requirements and ensure receipt of required documentation, including:

- Establish control procedures and practices to ensure recipients are eligible for payment; and
- Providing colleges with guidance and assistance on an as-needed basis.

Status – Partially Implemented

HESC's comments:

HESC continues to proactively work with high schools and colleges to ensure that STEM eligibility is accurately determined. HESC still plans to develop an online STEM certification video. Currently, HESC is focusing on priorities that have emerged in response to COVID-19. Once those activities are no longer emergent, and therefore a priority, HESC will focus on development of the online STEM certification video.

Recommendation 2

Review the \$81,198 in ineligible award payments and make recoveries, as appropriate.

Take steps to ensure that HESC policies and procedures comply with the regulations governing the Program

Recommendation 4

- Re-evaluating existing database systems, and where needed, taking steps to strengthen their abilities and controls; and
- Providing training to HESC staff regarding capabilities and functionality of different HESC database systems.

Status - Partially Implemented

HESC's comments:

Despite the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting NY PAUSE order, HESC continues to work toward the issuance of a Request for Proposal to modernize its application processing environment. Once the PAUSE order is lifted and all agency functions are returned to normal, HESC will continue its plan to issue the RFP during State Fiscal Year 2020-2021.
