Subject: Salary Increases for Certain State Officers and Judges and Justices of the Unified Court System

Chapter 55 of the Laws of 1979 provides for increases in salary, effective October 1, 1978, for State officers whose salaries are set in Section 169 of the Executive Law, for certain other officers, and for judges and justices of the Unified Court System. A list of the officers in the Executive Branch and the new salaries is attached. New salaries for the judges and justices have been distributed by the Office of Court Administration. The increase is payable from the first day of Payroll Period 14, (September 28, 1978).

The increased salaries and the retroactive adjustment should be reported by PR-75 in Payroll Period 3 for both current incumbents and previous incumbents whose service extended beyond October 1, 1978. The retroactive adjustment is calculated at the 365 day factor (.038356) through Period 26 and at the 366 day factor (.038251) for Periods 1 and 2. Transaction code SAL INCR is used for this purpose.

Use ADJ SAL PA as an additional transaction code to report the retroactive adjustment. If a former incumbent is due an adjustment and has not been paid during 1979, remember to use RESTORE PA as the primary transaction code.

Salaries for several positions have been reduced in the new Section 169. However, the law provides that the salary of an incumbent will not be reduced.

The positions of Secretary to the Governor, Counsel to the Governor, and Director of the Budget have been removed from Section 169. However, Chapter 55 provides for an increase in salary for these positions to \$51,146 retroactive to October 1, 1978. Effective April 1, 1979, the salary for these positions will be the salary as it appears on a Budget Certificate of Approval, but may not exceed \$54,730.
